Role of the Athletic Trainer

- Evaluate, manage, treat, and rehabilitate athletic injuries

- Administer and evaluate ImPACT concussion baseline testing

-Coordinate care as quickly as possible to be seen by a member of the HMC Orthopedic and Sports Medicine team or another care team of choice



What if a student athlete is injured?

- Healthy Roster student athlete tracking program
- Minor injuries managed by the ATC
- Complicated/moderate injuries can schedule appointments directly with HMC Orthopedic Team
- Usually same or next day appointments
- ATC will call or send a note home
- ATC is available by phone and email



When does the ATC work?

- School days – 3:00 PM until after events/practices are done

- Coverage at all home games
- Sports with greatest risk for injury take priority (football staffed over volleyball)

- Occasionally other members of the HMC sports medicine team will provide sideline coverage if the ATC is unavailable



ImPACT Concussion Testing

- Computerized Neurocognitive test that is used to help manage a concussion and safely return an athlete to play after a concussion.

- Test measures symptoms, reaction time, memory, processing speed, etc.

- ImPACT does not diagnose a concussion



How does ImPACT work?

 Baseline test given: typically during Freshman and Junior year, but we ensure a baseline has been collected within the last two years
 If a concussion is sustained:

 Athlete completes a return to play process
 ImPACT test repeated before full return to play





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
